PTSG Building Access Specialists Ltd, via its steeplejack and rope access specialists headquartered in Edinburgh, recently completed a technically complex project to enhance the interior of John Lewis' flagship store in Oxford Street, London.

John Lewis is a British brand of high-end department stores operating throughout the United Kingdom, with concessions also located in Ireland. From 1925 to 2022, the chain had a policy that it would always at least match a lower price offered by a national high street competitor; this pledge was known by the name "Never Knowingly Undersold".

PTSG's engineers completely repainted the internal escalators in John Lewis' famous Oxford Street store. A five-man team of rope access engineers installed rope rigging from the internal roof structure, which allowed them to access all areas of the escalators.

PTSG's engineers set up encapsulation areas to allow the scaling paintwork to be removed without impacting on any of the store's items for sale. The escalators were successfully prepared and painted to both protect and enhance them aesthetically, providing an improved experience for shoppers and staff alike.
